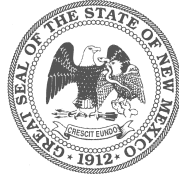

The New Mexico Gaming Control Board, through the State Gaming Representative, monitors the 2001 and 2007 Amended Tribal-State Class III Gaming Compacts signed by thirteen Tribes/Pueblos. The compacting Tribes/Pueblos pay revenue sharing and report "Net Win" on a quarterly basis. "Net Win" is the amount wagered on gaming machines, less the amount paid out in cash and non-cash prizes won on the gaming machines, less State and Tribal Regulatory Fees. "Net Win" is *not* the net profit of the casino. The total amount paid to the State Treasurer for revenue sharing by the thirteen Tribes/Pueblos operating casinos for the quarter ending **September 30, 2007** was **\$16,554,184.99**. This revenue is deposited into the General Fund of the State of New Mexico.
