The New Mexico Gaming Control Board, through the State Gaming Representative, monitors the 2001 and 2007 Amended Tribal-State Class III Gaming Compacts signed by 14 Tribes. The compacting Tribes pay revenue sharing and report "Net Win" on a quarterly basis. "Net Win" is the amount wagered on gaming machines, less the amount paid out in cash and non-cash prizes won on the gaming machines, less State and Tribal Regulatory Fees. "Net Win" is not the net profit of the casino. The total amount paid to the State Treasurer for revenue sharing by the Tribes operating casinos for the quarter ending **June 30, 2012** was **\$ 16,950,572**. This revenue is deposited into the General Fund of the State of New Mexico.
